What is **Palliative** Care?

Palliative Care is specialized medical care that provides patients relief from the symptoms and stress caused by serious illness and aggressive curative treatments.



Palliative Care Goes Hand-in-Hand With Curative Treatment

Palliative care can occur at the same time as all other treatments for your illness. There is absolutely no reason to wait. In fact, some studies have shown that palliative care may extend life, reduce the need for acute care – with fewer visits to physicians and emergency departments –, and reduce medical costs.^[1]

The Palliative Care Team will help you evaluate different options available, working with you and your doctor to ensure your treatment plan aligns with what is important to you.

- Provide relief from pain and other uncomfortable symptoms
- ✓ Assist you in making difficult medical decisions

Consultants Team:

The PMC doctors will work with your doctors to manage pain or other symptoms. They are certified in Palliative Care and have experience in providing expert medical care for those living with a serious illness.

NURSE PRACTITIONERS

Our nurse practitioners are certified and experienced in Palliative Care. They provide expert medical care, visit patients regularly, and assist in coordinating care.

SOCIAL WORKERS

Our social workers provide patients and families supportive counseling and practical resources to keep patients comfortable in their homes. They also help patients and families with difficult conversations and planning for the future.

CHAPLAINS

Our chaplains help people find comfort and answers within their own beliefs. Chaplains offer spiritual and emotional support to people of any faith background, or no faith background.

How is Palliative Care Reimbursed?

PMC accepts Medicare and CareFirst; note that a co-insurance or co-payment may be required. For other insurances, payment for services will be expected at the time of service. You will be responsible for obtaining reimbursement from your insurance company.
